The deadline for hotel reservations is fast approaching. Don't let it slip past you! Hotel reservations are due Monday, January 1, 2024. Certification and Registration

The deadline of Friday, December 15, 2023, for Certification has passed. We are making space for late submissions. The cutoff for last minute submissions and changes is before Saturday, January 6, 2024. Make sure you follow the instructions precisely. If you did not complete your certification by Friday, December 15, and you are receiving a copy of this email, please retain a copy of this email to distribute to your delegates if they have not received it directly as we cannot guarantee that they will receive it.

Registration may be completed at any time as your parish will register the delegates by the total number of clergy and lay delegates not by specific persons. Visitors may register at any time.

Nominations

Nominations for elected positions at the 40th annual convention in 2024 are now open! We are excited to annuance openings in elected diocesan leadership for Bishop and Council, Standing Committee, Disciplinary Board, and University of the South Trustee.

Nominations may be made only by the Bishop, Clerical and Lay Delegates, Vestries, and any other person authorized by Canon. See Rule 8.01. Nominations are due by Saturday, January 6, 2024. All nominees are invited to submit photo, detailed biography, and reasons for seeking the position to the respective diocesan office (no word limit). This information will be posted on the convention website. Nominees are also invited to submit an abbreviated 100-word informational profile to be included in convention materials. Additionally, all nominees will be invited to participate in a breakout session during convention to meet and answer questions from delegates and visitors. Resolutions

The Diocese of East Tennessee remains committed to providing time and space for healthy and productive dialogue embodied in the resolutions process. We welcome resolutions from the community for the purpose of creating a unified voice in the diocese. Please note the following information as a helpful guide as we prepare for the 40th Annual Convention.

When is deadline for submitting resolutions?

Proposed resolutions must be received at Diocesan House **no later than January 6**, **2023**, to be posted on our convention website and included in convention packet. Resolutions proposed after January 6, will be made from the floor of convention with a requirement of a 2/3rds vote from the convention to be considered immediately.

Safe Church Training

All parochial clergy, church staff, and delegates are required to be in compliance and current with their Safe Church requirements **by February 10, 2024**. To help with this, the diocese will offer **in-person training at 1:00-4:00 pm Friday, February 9th at St. John's Cathedral.** This just-in-time opportunity is before the Convention Eucharist. Training can also be completed online any time before the deadline.

This training is for clergy, staff, and convention delegates who still need to complete their course requirements. Additional public in-person opportunities will be offered in 2024.

Compliance must meet our diocesan standards. If someone has moved from a different diocese where they were required to take fewer courses, they must complete the missing work. If someone completed the "old" courses that met the Diocese of East Tennessee standards at the time of training, then they are considered to be compliant until the 3-year expiration date of their most recent certification.
